## EDF Site Update:

### Looking back and looking forward

#### 2016 in numbers:

1,314 = peak number of people on site in 2016

14,420 = total number of visitors/temporary workers in 2016

218,083 = bus passenger journeys made in 2016

20,875 = deliveries in 2016

133,138 = meals served in 2016

2,268 = people inducted in 2016

2017 is set to bring exciting new challenges for the project as EDF Energy Nuclear New Build continue to progress with their 10-year power station build. By the latter part of 2017, they will be halfway through the earthworks on the construction site, as well as beginning the early stages of the civil works phase. Many more trades will become part of the site as they steadily increase the amount of people they have contributing to construction.

Everybody has a role in delivering every HPC milestone - that's the message surrounding the six project-wide goals for 2017. 'HPC is a 10-year project - a marathon not a sprint', said Rob Jordan, Site Construction Director. 'Sometimes the big picture can be hard to take in because there are so many parts to it. These goals give us a guide to some of the major pieces that will get us there.'

'Our goals cut across the whole project, so we celebrate achieving them across our different locations in France, London, Bristol, Bridgwater, Barnwood and, of course, on site.'

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## Goals for 2017

- Start of HPC site accommodation campus
- First safety related concrete in gallery
- Completion of East welfare office
- Handover of the civil works design studies - *Reactor pre-stressing gallery*
- Handover of the civil works design studies - *Pumping station raft*
- Commence installation of CRF seawater cooling pipes.

\*The HPC project is organised into three command centres to reflect the distinct stages of their work. The Engineering Command Centre (ECC) is in France. The Delivery Command Centre (DCC) is in Bristol, with its associated offices in the Qube in London. The Site Office Command Centre (SCC) is at Hinkley Point and includes Mallard Court, their Induction Centre and associated developments.


## Reflection on 2016 and a look ahead for the next 6 months

The Heart of the South West Business Support Interim funding has enabled the HSC Team to focus on addressing the challenges of identifying construction, manufacturing and service work packages early enough to source the right suppliers meeting standards required.


During the 12 month period covered by this report, an additional 30 work package opportunities have been identified with a combined value estimated at over £100 million with 328 suppliers with matching capability promoted to the main contractors concerned. Seven supplier collaborations already in development at the start of this period have been supported with all seven now securing contracts on the project with a value estimated at £465 million during the build. A further four new collaborations have been supported to position themselves for contracts and these supplier groups are now being promoted to EDF Energy and main contractors.

Whilst some contractor engagement has so far resulted in a higher number of work packages assessed in comparison to others, these packages are of lower value (<£100k) compared to other packages that will be valued in excess of £1 million.

As the project is now ramping up, a higher degree of engagement will happen with BYLOR (Main Civils contractor) Premier WACO (Construction Offices), Bouygues (Ancillary Buildings) and Laing O'Rourke (Campus Accommodation).

## Hinkley Point Training Agency (HPTA) Update

The HPTA have recently (Feb 1st 2017) appointed an Operations Director to lead the organisation to grow training and skills provision and capability and provide the project contractors with a single point of contact to discuss training requirements. Neil England has extensive leadership experience in both commercial and public sector training provision, notably in the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB) as a member of the Senior Management Team, where he led the response to the Nuclear New Build Programme for the CITB's training delivery division, the National Construction College. He also worked on the Crossrail project with CITB in the setting up and running of the Tunnelling and Underground Construction Academy.



Neil will be immediately supported by an Operations Manager, Fi Topazio, who joins in March from a senior teaching leadership position at Bridgwater College.

Training solutions are already being delivered and the HPTA are also currently working on developing a pre-employment course for the Hinkley Point Jobs Service and a product to meet the need for providing the thousands of supervisory positions on-site with required knowledge around Nuclear Safety Awareness.

We would also encourage you to update your company financial turnover figures. If your figures are out of date then you could be missing out on excellent opportunities for growth as main contractor procurement teams will consider the financial turnover of suppliers for the higher value packages.
